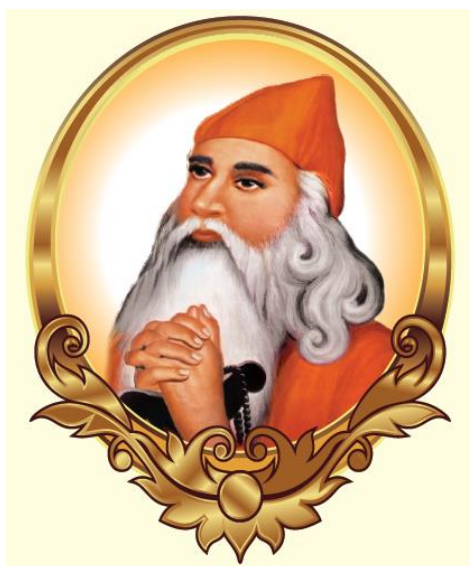

About Guru Jambheshwar Ji Maharaj



Guru Jambheshwar Ji Maharaj was a saint and great environmentalist of the 15th century. Amongst all the saints of the 15th century, Guru Jambheshwar Ji was unique in preaching about the conservation of biodiversity to his followers. He also included the same in his 29 commandments. Thus, Guru Jambheshwar Ji was not only a religious 'GURU' but a great ecologist and environmentalist, many centuries ahead of the scientists.

He was born in 1451 A.D. (Samvat 1508) on the 8th day of dark half of the Lunar month Bhadrapad on Janamashtami, in a village Pipasar situated in the revenue jurisdiction of Nagaur district of Rajasthan, India. He adopted the life of an ascetic teacher in 1484 AD and started living on the Samrathal, sand 999Dhora hill of Mukam village situated in Nokha tehsil of Bikaner district of Rajasthan. He enshrined in his followers' compassion towards nature and protection of life as the supreme religious goal.

He founded the Bishnoi sect in 1485 AD on eighth day of the black fortnight of the month of Kartika of the year 1542 of the Vikrami Era at Samrathal Dhora and prescribed 29 commandments dealing with various aspects of life. He spent the remaining 51 years of his life in spreading his great vision. He expounded his religious philosophy and the essence of these principles in the form of verses. These spiritual verses have a vigour of their own, vibrant, passionate and sincere. These are distinguished by their vivid and conversational style and moral exhortation. Guru Ji achieved 'Nirvana' in 1536 in village Lalasar District Bikaner, Rajasthan.

Among the 29 commandments laid down by Guru Jambheshwar Ji, eight commandments have been prescribed to preserve biodiversity and encourage good animal husbandry. Seven commandments provide directions for healthy social behavior. Ten Commandments are directed towards personal hygiene and maintaining good basic health. Four commandments provide guidelines for worshipping God daily and always remember that God is omnipresent. Guru Jambheshwar Ji had occupied a unique place in the Bhakti movement. Though his area of activity had been mainly the desert land of Thar, yet he had been touring other places too. During these extensive tours he has been spreading the message;

“Jeeya Nai Jugati or Mhan (Moova) Nai Mugati”.

(To live is a device and to die is salvation) within and outside the country

In addition to this, the University has been ranked in band 101-150 among the Universities/Institutes in India as per National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2022. The University has secured 33rd rank in Pharmacy category and is ranked in band 102-125 in Management category under NIRF 2022. The University has also been ranked in band 1001-1200 in the Times Higher Education World University 2022 and in band 251-300 among ASIA University ranking 2021. The University has been granted graded Autonomy and UGC has placed it in Category-II University. It is one amongst the 21 State Universities of the Country to have achieved this position. This University has also been admitted for the 3rd time for Global Initiative of Academic of Network (GIAN) Phase-III Scheme, a prestigious scheme of MHRD (MOE).

The candidates submitting Online Application Form for Entrance Test are required to pay requisite amount of fee through Net banking or Debit/Credit Card on or before the last date of payment of fee mentioned in Key Dates as mentioned in the Prospectus 2022-23 for admission to Postgraduate Programmes of Affiliated Colleges of the University or uploaded on the University website. The Application Form will only be accepted in online mode. The candidate do not have any right of admission on the basis of Application Form, if submitted other than online mode.

8. A candidate allowed to appear in the Entrance Test provisionally, if found ineligible on verification of documents/certificates by the College concerned will not be allowed admission whatsoever be her/his rank in the Entrance Test.
9. If at any stage, it is found that the candidate has supplied incomplete and/or false and/or incorrect information on the Online Application Form for Entrance Test, her/his candidature for the programme

shall stand cancelled and she/he will be liable to disciplinary action as per the University rules and the fees deposited by her/him shall be forfeited.

10. No student shall be permitted to be on the rolls of two different departments/ regular programmes of the Affiliated Colleges or University simultaneously.
11. If the College authorities are not satisfied with the character, past behaviour and antecedents of a candidate, she/he may be denied admission to any programme/course of study in the College. In order to safeguard academic standards and ensure discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the College, the Principal may cancel the admission of any student.
12. In case, a candidate submits any document in the College, she/he is required to obtain a receipt from the College concerned that specifically mentions the particulars and the date of submission of the document(s).
13. The selection of a candidate for admission to a Postgraduate Programme in the Affiliated Colleges of the University will be based on the Merit List/ Seat allocation List drawn on the basis of criteria mentioned in Chapter-5 of the Prospectus 2022-23 for Postgraduate Programmes of Affiliated Colleges of the University, subject to fulfilling other conditions as given in the Prospectus. Further, admission to Additional Seats for Sports person, if any, over and above sanctioned intake of a Programme will be made on the basis of merit list drawn as per criteria mentioned in Chapter-5 of the Prospectus 2022-23.
14. As per policy of the Distance Education Council, New Delhi vide letter F.No. DEC/ Notification/40.5.1.5/2012 dated 01.11.2012, a student can pursue two programmes simultaneously through distance or combination of distance and regular modes from the same or different University(ies)/Institution(s) in various combinations, viz,
 - (i) One Degree and one Diploma/ PG Diploma/ Certificate
 - (ii) One PG Diploma and one Diploma/ Certificate
 - (iii) One Diploma and one Certificate
 - (iv) Two PG Diplomas
 - (v) Two Diplomas
 - (vi) Two Certificates

These above combinations of programmes are subject to directions of the UGC from time to time. Further, the programmes offered by the University through Distance Education mode are available on the University website. 25% concession of total fees of distance learning programmes will be allowed to the students pursuing regular courses in GJUS&T, Hisar or any other recognized University/College, who are interested simultaneously to join a distance learning programme. The candidate claiming this concession will be required to produce a certificate of bonafide student from the head of the institution concerned.

15. The schedule of Teaching and Vacations for the session 2022-23 shall be uploaded on the University Website later on and the same will be followed in the Affiliated Colleges of the University.
16. The Students' Union Election of the Affiliated Colleges of the University will be conducted only after receiving Government instructions, if any, at a later stage.

17. There shall be no rounding off fraction of percentage of marks from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility for admission to various programmes. In case two or more candidates in the merit list have equal percentage of marks, the candidate senior in age will be considered first.
18. No programme/course/option will be started by the Affiliated Colleges if the minimum strength of admitted students in that programme/course/option is less than the strength prescribed by the Director General Higher Education, Haryana. The directions in this regard issued by the Director General Higher Education, Haryana as well as University from time to time will be followed strictly by the college concerned.
19. No Inter-College Migration shall be allowed by the University unless the student has been registered in this University.
20. No Inter-Varsity or Inter College Migration shall be considered during the 1st year of any Programme/Course or in the Programme/Course having one year duration.
21. Inter-College Migration shall not be allowed from the Affiliated Colleges to the University Teaching Departments or vice-versa.
22. No student shall be allowed promotion to the next higher class without Registration Number allotted by the University. If Principal of the College concerned allows promotion without fulfilling eligibility conditions/Registration Number to any student, she/he will be responsible for this lapse and admission of such students may be treated as cancelled ab-initio.
23. Instructions of University/State Govt./UGC shall be followed by the Affiliated Colleges for refund of fee of a student, if she/he choose to withdraw from a PG Programme in the Affiliated Colleges of the University.
24. In the event of any inconsistency in the rules or any clarification thereof, the matter shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor for interpretation, whose decision shall be final and binding. The Vice-Chancellor is also competent to remove any inconsistency/make amendment in rules at any time and decide which provision shall take precedence over the other.
25. Any legal dispute relating to admission of candidates will be subject to jurisdiction of the Courts at Hisar.
26. **(i) ZERO TOLERANCE ON RAGGING:**
 - Ragging in the University/College Campus is totally banned.
 - Any student found indulging in the act of ragging shall be liable to disciplinary action as per the University rules.
 - Anyone who witnesses a ragging incident or being ragged on the campus can submit her/his complaint immediately through contact number/e-mail to the Principal of the college concerned or the Committee constituted by the College for this purpose.

(ii) As per 2nd amendment in UGC Regulations vide letter No. F.1-15/2009 (ARC) pt-III dated 04th August 2014 on curbing the menace of ragging in higher education institutions, it is compulsory for each student and every parent to submit an ONLINE undertaking in every academic year. Submitting an ONLINE Undertaking/affidavits to the college is mandatory as per the instructions of the UGC. Accordingly, the college concerned should create a link "ZERO TOLERANCE ON

RAGGING” on their college website so that students may submit online Undertaking for Anti-ragging.

- (iii) Hon'ble Supreme Court of India Orders- Curbing Ragging in Educational Institutions- Prospectus admission:

“If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty/chance to explain which if found unsatisfactory, shall be expelled from the institution, as orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India”.

Instructions for curbing ragging: Ragging in educational institutions is banned and anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately, which may include suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period, expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period or fine as per UGC guidelines up to Rs. 2.50 lacs. The punishment may also take the shape of (i) withholding scholarships or other benefits, (ii) debarring from representation in events, (iii) withholding results, (iv) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess. If the individuals, committing or abetting ragging, are not/ cannot be identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

The following will be termed as the act of ragging:

Any disorderly conduct whether spoken or written or by an act, which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student(s), indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in fresher or junior student(s) or asking the student(s) to do any act or perform something, which such student(s) will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher student.

27. Smoking/ drinking/ possession or consumption of prohibited drugs is strictly prohibited on the Campus of the Affiliated Colleges of the University and is considered as an offence. If any student is found indulging in such activities, strict action will be taken against them. If anyone is found violating this rule, the same may be brought to the notice of the Principal or respective committee of the college concerned.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF “ONLINE APPLICATION FORM FOR ENTRANCE TEST” FOR ADMISSION TO PG PROGRAMMES OF AFFILIATED COLLEGES

1. **THE CANDIDATES ARE REQUIRED TO UPLOAD FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS/CERTIFICATES AT THE TIME OF FILLING-UP THE ONLINE APPLICATION FORM FOR ENTRANCE TEST FOR A PG PROGRAMME:**
 - (i) DMC of Qualifying Examinations i.e. B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com./ B.E./ B.Tech./ B.Pharma / B.P.Th./ M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. and LLB etc. as per eligibility of the programme given in **“Chapter-3: Eligibility for Admissions”** of this Prospectus. In case of the candidates appearing in qualifying examinations if the result of nth semester/year is not declared till the date of Counseling/Reporting, the Pass Result of first (n-1) semesters/years of qualifying examination is required at the time of Counseling/Reporting, where ‘n’ stands for total number of semesters/years of qualifying examinations.
 - (ii) Certificates of 10th and 12th class for the purpose of registration in the University etc.
 - (iii) Reserved Category (SC/Deprived SC/BCA/BCB/PH (Differently-abled person)/ EWS/ ESM/ FF etc. of Haryana) certificate for Reservation in proper format, if applicable. The specimen formats are given as Annexures B-I to B-VII.
 - (iv) Sports Grading Certificate, issued by the Department of Sports & Youth Affairs, Govt. of Haryana for admission on additional seats for Sportsperson.
 - (v) Proper “Income” certificate / Affidavit in case of SC/Deprived SC /BC candidates of Haryana seeking any concession/ reservation.
 - (vi) Proper “Income and Asset Certificate” in case of EWS candidates of Haryana seeking any concession/reservation. The specimen format is given as Annexure B-VII.
 - (vii) Family ID of Parivar Pahchan Patra (PPP) issued by the Govt. of Haryana, if required.
2. **BEFORE INITIATING THE PROCESS OF SUBMISSION OF ONLINE APPLICATION FORM FOR ENTRANCE TEST, A CANDIDATE SHOULD ENSURE THAT SHE/HE HAS ARRANGED:**

 - (ii) Scanned Signatures (in jpeg or jpg format only)

 - (iii) Scanned copy of Category Certificate, if candidate is claiming for reservation category (in jpg format, Max (W-H): 1200-1600px, Min (W-H): 400-400px, Size upto 200kb).
3. A candidate can apply for admission to a programme only online by visiting the link **“Admission 2022-23 PG Programme of Affiliated Colleges”** available on University Website **www.gjust.ac.in**. (The deposition of Registration Fee will entitle the candidate to participate in admission process subject to fulfilment of eligibility conditions mentioned in Prospectus (2022-23) for admission to Postgraduate (PG) Programmes of the Affiliated Colleges of the University.

4. A Registration Fee of Rs. 400/- for General Category; Rs. 100/- for SC, Deprived SC, BCA and BCB category candidates of Haryana; and Rs. 200/- for Economical Weaker Sections (EWS) candidates of Haryana is to be submitted through Debit/Credit Card or Net Banking for each programme (separately if applying for more than one programme).
5. Each candidate will go through all the eight stages one-by-one as mentioned below: -
 - (i) Candidate Registration
 - (ii) Upload photo, signature and reservation category certificate (if applicable)
 - (iii) Registration Fee payment
 - (iv) Detailed Application Form
 - (v) Educational details.
 - (vi) Upload DMCs, Certificates for any kind of weightage claimed.
 - (vii) Review Application Form / Lock Application Form.
 - (viii) Download/print Application Form.

Part-I
(Candidate Registration)

6. Click on “New Candidate Registration” option to accomplish Part-I of submission.
7. The system will ask for the candidate’s personal information like: -
 - a. Domicile of Haryana Resident (Yes/No)
 - b. Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP) ID
 - c. Name of the Programme
 - d. Candidate Mobile number
 - e. Land Line Number
 - f. Parents’ Mobile Number
 - g. Email ID
 - h. Password and Re-enter Password
8. The candidates paying registration fee of reserved category must upload the valid category certificate as a proof of fee concession claim.
9. The candidates are required to go through the details of particulars filled in the form before registration confirmation. It is to ensure that all information is correct and click on ‘Register’ button. After confirmation, the candidate will not be in a position to change/alter/update the information.
10. Category must be selected carefully while filling of Online Application Form for Entrance Test. If a candidate request for category change before last date for submission of Online Application Form for Entrance Test and payment of fee through Net Banking/Debit/Credit Card, the following/procedure will be adopted for registration fee:-

- i) In case, candidate has paid less registration fee under earlier category, her/his category will not be changed and she/he will have to submit fresh application in desired category with requisite/required registration fee before last date of payment of fee. The fee already paid by her/him will be forfeited.
 - ii) If candidate has paid excess registration fee, her/his category will be changed and balance fee will be forfeited.
11. After successful registration, system generated User ID and Password will be sent to the candidate on her/his registered e-mail ID. The candidate is required to keep their User ID and Password undisclosed. In the event of sharing of password, the candidate will be sole responsible for the change of registration details etc.

Part-II

(Upload Image Signature and Category Certificate)

12. After successful registration, the candidates have to upload latest photo, signature and valid category certificate for reserved category candidates who are seeking registration fee concession. This is to remind the candidate that she/he is required to upload the images of recent photograph, signature and category certificate (if applicable) only in jpeg or jpg format as per dimensions given at Point No. 2.

Part-III

(Registration Fee payment)

13. After uploading of photo, signature and category certificate (if any), the candidate will pay the requisite Registration Fee in online mode only through Debit/Credit Card/Net banking.
14. The Candidate without depositing the Fee, shall not be allowed to participate in further admission process.

Part-IV

(Detailed Application Form)

15. After successful submission of fee, information regarding correspondence address, marital status, ex-serviceman/ward etc. will be filled by the candidate.

Part-V

(Educational Details)

16. After completion of Part-IV, educational details from 10th class onward with roll no, passing year, board/university, marks/CGPA obtained, maximum marks, multiplication factor (if any) will be filled by the candidate. The candidates who have their results in CGPA have to provide CGPA multiplication factor and fill actual percentage in application form.

Part-VI

(Upload DMCs, Certificates, Sports Gradation Certificate if any)

17. After attaching the requisite documents, candidate has to upload the documents by clicking the upload documents button.

Part-VII

(Review/Edit Application, Lock Form)

18. To have a brief look on online filled Application Form, a preview will be displayed to verify the credentials filled by the candidate. If the candidates find everything correct then lock the Application Form to obtain the print copy of online submitted application form. If the candidates find that some correction is required, she/he may change such information by clicking Edit Button. Admit card for Entrance Test will not be generated for incomplete application form and such students will not be allowed to appear in Entrance Test.

Part-VIII

(Download/Print Application Form)

19. Candidates are required to download and keep hard copy (Two Copies) of Online Application Form for Entrance Test for future and should visit the University Website regularly for update during the entire admission process.
20. Further, the candidates may make correction(s), if any, in their online information on request through **e-mail: pgadmission@gjust.org** with documentary proof, as per the prescribed schedule only (Refer Key Dates). Thereafter, no correction(s) in online information of candidate will be allowed, in any case.
21. The candidate must ensure that her/his mobile number, E-mail Id as filled in the Online Application Form for Entrance Test is active for communication. The candidate herself/himself shall be held responsible for non-receipt of latest information due to wrong/disabled mobile number or mailing address.
22. THE CANDIDATES ARE REQUIRED TO VISIT THE UNIVERSITY WEBSITE REGULARLY AND CHECK THEIR EMAILS AND SMSs FOR LATEST UPDATES AND INFORMATION, IF ANY, DURING ENTIRE PROCESS OF ADMISSION.
23. Registration Fee once paid shall not be refunded in any case. However, if a candidate pays the requisite registration fee twice for one programme due to some technical reasons, one-time fee will be refunded to the candidate on written request on the recommendations of the Director, Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Computer & Informatics Centre (PDUCIC) by the Accounts Branch of the University.

CHAPTER-1

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

General

Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar (formerly Guru Jambheshwar University), a State University, was established on October 20, 1995 by an Act of the Legislature of the State of Haryana to facilitate and promote studies and research in emerging areas of higher education with a focus on achieving excellence in new frontiers of Basic Sciences, Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Environmental Studies, Non-conventional Sources of Energy and Management Studies. It was formally inaugurated on November 1, 1995. It is named after Guru Jambheshwar Ji Maharaj, a saint environmentalist of 15th century. The University is situated at Hisar, a rapidly growing town situated at 167 Km. from Delhi on Delhi-Rohtak- Hisar-Sirsa-Fazilka National Highway (NH-9) and at a distance of 231 Km. from Chandigarh on NH-65. The University is situated over a sprawling area of about 372 acres. The campus is laid out with picturesque landscape, numerous buildings of appealing designs and wide road network. It presents a spectacle of harmony in architecture and natural beauty. Approximately, 275 acres of land have been developed providing all facilities such as water supply, street lighting, electricity supply and parks/ lawns etc.

The University has been recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under Section 2(f) for recognition of degrees on 11.1.1996 and under section 12(B) of the UGC Act to be eligible for central assistance on 7.2.1997. The University is 'A' Grade accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), since 2002. The University has also got international rank-band 1001-1200 Times Higher Education World University Ranking, UK-2021. In addition to this, the university has been ranked in band 101-150 among Universities of India in India by NIRF in 2022. Further, the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences has been ranked 33rd and Haryana School of Business is ranked in 102-125 band in India by NIRF in 2022. Further, this University has been graded as Category-II University for Grant of Graded Autonomy as per Categorization of the Universities under UGC Regulations, 2018. The University Grants Commission has granted autonomy to the University for maintaining high academic standards. Due to this, the University will remain within the ambit of UGC but will have the freedom to start new programmes, Off Campus Centres, Skill Development Courses, Research Park and many other Academic programmes. The University also has the freedom to hire Foreign Faculty, enroll foreign students, give incentive base emoluments to the faculty, enter into academic collaborations and run open Distance Learning Programmes. This University stands at 21st position among the State Universities in India and 2nd position in Haryana State. The dimension of autonomy for Category-II Universities will be as per notification, dated 12th Feb., 2018 issued by University Grants Commission, New Delhi.

Jurisdiction

The State Government vide notification No. S.O.7/H.A. 17/1995/S.4/17 dated 21.06.2017 has defined the jurisdiction and authorized the university to exercise its power on all type of colleges of District Hisar. Further, as per instructions issued by the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide its Memo No. DHE-010019/6/2020-Coordination-DHE dated 14.07.2022 has intimated that the State Govt. has decided that online admissions of PG programmes in the Degree Colleges (Govt./Aided/SFC) shall be made by the concerned affiliating University w.e.f. 2022-23 through their online admission portal. The instructions for the admission to the Principals of Colleges shall be timely issued by the affiliating University with intimation to the Higher Education Department, Panchkula.

CHAPTER-2

ABOUT THE AFFILIATED COLLEGES OF THE UNIVERSITY

GOVT. AIDED COLLEGES:

1. CHHAJU RAM MEMORIAL JAT COLLEGE, HISAR

In order to immortalize the memory of Seth Sir Chhaju Ram a great philanthropist and altruist of his time, Chhaju Ram Memorial Jat College was established in 1967. However, the seed of this institute had already been sown way back in 1926 in pre-independence era, when monumental building of Jat High School was got built by him in memory of his son, Adit Kumar. Seth Chhaju Ram Ji (1865-1943) hailed from village Alakhpura in district Bhiwani. He was concerned about the illiteracy among ruralites. Consequently, he thought of disseminating education among the countryside people by establishing this school at an estimated cost of Rs. 4 Lakh, a huge amount in those days. The school started imparting education upto matriculation right from early thirties.

The credit of upgrading the school into a degree college can be attributed to three late luminaries. They were founder President, late Ch. Suraj Mal Ji, General Secretary, Late Justice Davender Lamba and founder Principal, late Sh. S.S.Gill. Their contribution to the college has been an instance of rare devotion. Their tireless and continuous efforts were certainly of great help in meeting the challenges of the formative period of the college.

Since its inception in 1967, the college is deemed as a premier institution of Haryana. It was initially affiliated to Punjab University, Chandigarh. From the academic session 1974-75, the institution was affiliated to Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. Of late, the college, along with other colleges of district Hisar, is affiliated to Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar from the session 2017-18. The college has been duly recognized by the UGC under section 2 (f) & 12 (B) for grant under UGC Act 1956 since its inception. The primary objective of the institution has been to uplift the rural youth by imparting higher education. With this purpose in mind, the college started functioning with a bare tally of 140 students in four classes, namely Prep Science, Prep Arts, B.A. and B.Sc. having premonition about established colleges running Arts & Science faculties, the management of college introduced commerce faculty. This bold initiative gradually drove the institution towards an era of glory in the field of education. The college today is catering the needs of over 5000 students across different streams. Its central location in the town and a well fortified campus is not only facilitating to urban boys and girls but also to commuter hailing from suburban or rural areas. Since the college is situated in the vicinity of the Railway station and is also adjoining the main Delhi Highway, it accords easy access to avail of the facility of higher education.

2. DAYANAND COLLEGE, HISAR

Dayanand College, Hisar is a 65 Years old, Re-Accredited as 'A' Grade institution by NAAC, Bengaluru in November 2016. The temple of learning is a nursery of higher education. The college owes its existence to the vision and missionary zeal of Lala Gian Chand Mahajan (later venerated as Swami Munishwaranand) who was a teacher by profession, a social crusader by inclination, and a saint by temperament. Swami ji was helped in his crusade by a galaxy of philanthropists and missionaries. The college is a multi-faculty, co-educational government-aided institution affiliated to Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar. Founded in the historical city of Hisar in 1950, the college was taken over by the DAV College Managing Committee, New Delhi in 1962. The emergence of this seat of learning marked a new era in this educationally and culturally obscure land even after independence. It was a dust bowl, a dry, dreary and dismal darkness. The opening of a college here was thus like creating oasis in the desert.

The college is situated on two campuses, occupying a total land area of about 28 acres out of which 4 acres of land is for the college complex and 24 acres of land is harnessed for creating facilities like hostels, staff quarters and sports ground and indoor sports complex.

As the first recipient of Best College Award in 1997, instituted by, Higher Education, Haryana, we are aware of the responsibilities that this award bestows upon us. Our commitment to excellence includes creation of personal excellence going in tandem with social responsibility. We are committed to inculcate free, objective and critical interest in our students. Here we encourage them to communicate openly and honestly. At the same time we proud them to maximize their personal growth and to take successful initiatives. We are committed to give them quality education. They should know everything about something and something about everything. We motive them to have positive and well-defined goals in life. We are committed to creating an atmosphere of intellectual vigour and ethical value foregrounding vedic heritage and honest pluralism. Our password is sincerity multiplied with hard work.

Faculty: The college helps and enables the faculty to update themselves by encouraging them to hold and to attend different academic programs such as seminars, conferences, workshops and refresher and orientation courses. The college has organized nearly a dozen national seminars an conference in various discipline sponsored by UGC and Director General Higher Education. They are always eager to update themselves and to implement new technologies. We aim at encouraging research in all the disciplines of education and in this direction, we approach various agencies to fund and to guide such projects.

3. FATEH CHAND COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, HISAR

Fateh Chand College for Women, Hisar is one of the leading colleges in the field of Women education in Haryana. The motto of the college is : Agnina Agni Samidhyate which means that light of knowledge may spread in the whole society. The main aim of the institution is to produce educated girls who will go on to educate and guide other girls for a better and brighter future. The college was established by Seth Rai Fateh Chand Ji in the year 1935 in Lahore. He donated his entire wealth to start an institution solely dedicated to the female literacy.

After Independence in the year 1954, a group of philanthropists got together in Hisar, Haryana to start the institution again to provide quality education to girls of Hisar region. The college was precious gift to the people of Hisar. The Institution has been progressing by leaps and bounds since then. It has earned a name for itself throughout the years.

When the college was started in 1954, there were very few colleges offering education to only girls. The society of Hisar as well as Haryana was very conservative at that time. Very few lucky people were able to get college education at that time. It was very rare for parents to think of sending their daughters for higher education. They did not like that their girls should study along with boys.

- To make law graduates capable of competing for judicial services, and placement in the multinational corporations.
- To provide maximum professional opportunities to the youth of the state.

CHAPTER-3

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSIONS

The candidates possessing the following qualifications/eligibility criteria are eligible for admission to the respective PG Programmes of Affiliated Colleges of the University in the session 2022-23:

CHAPTER-4

INFORMATION RELATED TO ELIGIBILITY/ ADMISSION

1. The candidate appearing in the qualifying examination may also fill up Online Application Form for Entrance Test for admission to any PG programme in the Affiliated Colleges of the University. However, she/he has to submit the Pass Result / DMC of Qualifying Examination or Pass Result / DMC upto (n-1)th semesters/years if the result of nth semester/year (where n stands for total number of semester/ years of a programme) is not declared, at the time of Counselling / Reporting failing which her/his candidature for admission to PG programme shall liable to be cancelled by the Admission Committee of the College concerned.
2. The following examinations are recognised for the admission to relevant PG programmes of affiliated Colleges of the University:
 - (i) 10+2 examination of C.B.S.E., New Delhi, Council for Indian School Certificate Examinations, New Delhi, Board of School Education, Haryana, State Council for Vocational Education, Haryana, or an equivalent examination of Statutory Boards examining bodies of the other States/Union Territories, recognized by the Haryana Board of School Education, Bhiwani.
 - (ii) Graduate and Post-Graduate Degrees of all Indian Universities, Deemed Universities, Institutions of National Importance which are on the list of University Grants Commission.
 - (iii) All examinations of foreign Universities, Boards, Examination Bodies, which have been recognized by the Association of Indian Universities.
 - (iv) Diploma in Pharmacy Examination conducted by Boards of Technical Education and various Universities in India, recognized by the Pharmacy Council of India.
 - (v) Diploma Courses in Engineering and Technology approved by State Boards of Technical Education.
 - (vi) One-sitting Bachelor's Degree programme up to the session 1995-96 from a recognized University.
 - (vii) M.A./M.Com./M.Sc. (one sitting) up to June, 1999 from a recognized University.
 - (viii) AMIE is equivalent to B.Tech. (in respective subject) for the purpose of admission.
 - (ix) All courses/programmes through correspondence/ distance education mode of all the Statutory Universities/ Deemed to be Universities including open/ private Universities established by an Act of State Legislature/ Parliament which are approved by University Grants Commission and Distance Education Council or the Joint Committee of UGC, AICTE, DEC now Distance Education Bureau (DEB) as the case may be. However, the updated list of such Universities may be seen on DEC now Distance Education Bureau (DEB) website www.deb.ac.in.
 - (x) As per policy laid down by the AICTE, the qualifications acquired through distance education mode at Diploma, Bachelor & Master level in the field of Engineering, Technology, Architecture Town Planning, Pharmacy, Hotel Management & Catering Technology, Applied Arts & Crafts are not recognized by AICTE (Public Notification issued by the AICTE)

3. It will be the sole responsibility of the candidate to produce the proof of approval of her/his course/programme/degree by Distance Education Council or Joint Committee of DEC Distance Education Bureau (DEB), UGC and AICTE or any other statutory body, as the case may be.
4. State wise list of fake Universities declared by the University Grants Commission taken from their website is attached at Annexure-III for ready reference. However, updated list can be downloaded from the UGC website www.ugc.ac.in.
5. The rules regarding admission of candidate(s) who passed their qualifying examination from EASTERN INSTITUTE FOR INTERGRATED LEARNING IN MANAGEMENT UNIVERSITY (EILLM) AND CMJ UNIVERISTY, MEGHALIYA are as under:
 - a) The candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from EILLM University through Regular mode (who submitted the proof of regular course of EILLM University, Sikkim at the time of admission) if otherwise eligible, may be considered for admission in the course.
 - b) The candidates who have passed their qualifying examinations from EILLM University, Sikkim through Distance mode or whose mode has not been mentioned, and who have not submitted any proof/information regarding the mode of passing the qualifying examination from EILLM University, Sikkim at the time of admission may not be considered for admission in the course.
 - c) In case candidate(s) has/have passed their qualifying examination from CMJ University, instructions issued by the Director Technical Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide Memo No. 20/11-2013 UNP(5) dated 01.07.2013 and subsequently by the Academic branch of the University vide Endst. No Acad/AC-II/46/2013/2446-86 dated 02.08.2013 shall be considered at the time of admission.
6. Unless otherwise specifically provided for a course in the concerned Ordinance, the eligibility condition for Scheduled Castes will be minimum pass marks in the qualifying examinations for admission to a course.
7. In case where specific relaxation of 5% marks in eligibility condition is to be to SC candidates, the same will be calculated as per instructions conveyed by the Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana, Chandigarh vide letter No. 22/129/2013-1GS III dated 16.07.2014 as per procedure prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various courses/programme for reserved category candidates in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011 e.g.

"A General candidate requires to have 50% marks, then as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved category candidate should be calculated as under:-

Out of 100 marks needs to less	=	5
Out of 1 Marks needs to less	=	5/100
Out of 50 marks needs to less	=	5/100 x50 = 2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidate will be 50 – 2.50 = 47.50 and not 45."
8. The Principals of the Affiliated Colleges of this University shall strictly follow the minimum eligibility conditions prescribed by the University and laid down in the Prospectus for admission to PG

Programme of the Affiliated Colleges. The Eligibility of all the candidates, even if they are admitted through online mode by the University, should be checked by the College itself before the confirmation of admissions. Wrong admissions pointed out by the University on the receipt of documents, shall not be regularized/accepted and Principals of Colleges shall be fully responsible for any wrong admission. No excuse like admissions are made through Counseling/Admission Committee etc. for wrong admissions will be entertained. Registration of such students will not be finalized by the university.

9. The candidate having re-appear in one paper either in 5th or 6th semester of their qualifying examination may be considered for admission to PG Programmes at her/his own risk/responsibility in last Physical Counselling against the seats remaining vacant after the admission of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination, as per following criteria:
 - i) The candidate having re-appear in only one paper either in 5th or 6th semester at under graduate level other than the subject in which she/he is interested to seek admission in PG programme of Two Year or more duration.
 - ii) The candidate having re-appear in only one paper either in 5th or 6th semester of B.Com./ BBA or re-appear in one subject other than Economics in 5th or 6th semester in B.A. if she/he is interested to seek admission in M.Com.
 - iii) The admission of above candidates is subject to the condition that they will have to pass their concerned re-appear paper before the promotion to 3rd semester of the PG Programme. If they fail to pass the concerned re-appear paper before the promotion to 3rd semester, their provisional admission to the PG Programme shall be cancelled *ab-initio* and the fee deposited by them will be forfeited. An undertaking as per format prescribed at **Annexure-B-IX** must be taken by the Colleges concerned from such candidates at the time of the admission.
10. Foreign Candidates have to obtain eligibility certificate from the University prior to consideration of their cases for admissions in PG Programmes of Affiliated Colleges. In no case, the College shall admit any foreign candidate without production of Eligibility Certificate which will be issued by the Registration Branch of the University on the payment of eligibility fee of Rs. 80 as mentioned at Sr. No. 2 of the Notification issued vide Endst. Acad./AC-I/2018/2679-2791 dated 15.06.2018 placed at Annexure-D of the General Instruction/ Guidelines for Admission to various courses running in affiliated colleges affected from the academic session 2021-22.
11. All students will be admitted by the College provisionally at their own risk and responsibility after obtaining undertaking in writing from the students. This undertaking must be got printed in the College Admission Form in the following format:

"I solemnly declare that the information detailed by me in the Admission Form is correct to the best of my knowledge and belief and nothing has been concealed therein. I also do undertake to abide by all the rules, regulations and instructions of the College and also of the University. I am taking admission in the College provisionally at my own risk and responsibility subject to confirmation of my admission by the University. If, at any stage, I am declared ineligible and my admission is cancelled by the College/ University ab-initio, I will abide by the orders of the University and forego every right to claim for it."

12. If a student is absent from the classes continuously for fifteen days in a semester/ year without intimating the Principal of the affiliated College/Institute concerned, her/his name shall be removed from the College/Institute roll. If the Principal of the affiliated colleges/ institutes concerned thinks that the candidate deserves to be re-admitted keeping in view the genuineness of request of the candidate within same semester/year, she/he will be allowed re-admission by the Principal of the affiliated College/ Institute concerned on payment of fee of Rs. 1500/- taking into consideration the possibility of fulfilling the requirement of attendance to be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations as per University Ordinance/programme ordinance.
13. No student shall be permitted to be on the rolls of two different regular degree programme(s), simultaneously. If a candidate takes admission in one degree programme in an academic year and thereafter in any next semester/year during the duration of the course, if she/he takes admission in another degree programme(s) in regular mode without withdrawal of her/his admission in first degree programme, the admission of the student will be treated as cancelled in first degree programme. Such students will not be allowed for re-admission in their first degree programme.
14. If a student is absent from the classes continuously for fifteen days in a semester/ year or drop out the full semester/year in any UG & PG programme due to any reason except at sr. no. (13) above, without intimating the Principal of the affiliated College/Institute concerned, her/his name shall be removed from the roll of the College/Institute. If the Principal of the affiliated colleges/ institutes concerned thinks that the candidate deserves to be re-admitted keeping in view the genuineness of reason of the candidate within maximum period of the duration, she/he will be allowed re-admission by the Principal of the concerned affiliated College/ Institute on payment of fee of Rs. 1500/- (as re-admission fee) taking into consideration the possibility of fulfilling the requirement of attendance to be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations as per University Ordinance. For the students detained/ dropped out for entire semester/session / year the prescribed full fee will be charged in addition to re-admission fee. The Principal of the concerned college will also ensure that the regular classes of the candidate in remaining semester/ year will be completed within the maximum duration of the course.
15. **PROMOTION TO NEXT HIGHER CLASSES:**
- A) For promotion to next higher class in UG and PG programmes, there will be no condition of passing papers for promotion to higher semester/year in any academic programme subject to the fulfilment of the criteria of the completion of the lectures prescribed in Clause 1.12 of University Ordinance Calendar Vol. II, but she/he has to complete the degree within the maximum period allowed under the Ordinance. **However, a student who is not on the rolls and whose name was struck off cannot be promoted to next higher class.**
- B) As per Clause 1.12, University Ordinance Calendar Vol. II, End Semester Examinations (Major Tests) shall be open to a regular student who:
- i) has been on the rolls of the Department/Institution during the semester; and
 - ii) has completed atleast 75% of the lectures in aggregate of each paper, seminar, case discussion, field trips, tutorials, etc. and not less than 50% in any one of these. The Chairpersons/Directors/Principals will take care of this condition at the time of allowing candidates to appear in minor tests as well. A deficiency upto 10% may be condoned by the Chairpersons/Directors/Principals.

The concerned College shall submit a certificate in respect of Clause (i) and (ii) above to the Results/Conduct Branch of the University before issuance of the Examinations Roll nos. to the students.

16. RULES FOR MAIN/RE-APPEAR/IMPROVEMENT EXAMINATIONS:

- i) The examination of odd semester of all programmes being run by affiliated Colleges except Education will be held in November/ December and even semester in May/June in an Academic year, on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and the students will have to appear accordingly.
- ii) Supplementary/re-appear/ improvement examinations for the courses being run under affiliated degree colleges will be held as per Odd / Even Scheme of regular students i.e. Odd Semester in December/ January and Even Semester in May/ June.

17. MAXIMUM DURATION OF PROGRAMME:

- i) Normally, a student is expected to complete her/his programme within the minimum period as laid down under the relevant Regulation of the University which should be in conformity with the UGC Regulations on the award of First Degree and Master's Degree and also in line with the notification, issued from time to time, on Specification of Degrees under Section 22 of UGC Act, 1956.
- ii) A student who for whatever reasons is not able to complete the programme within the normal period or the minimum duration prescribed for the programme, may be allowed two years period beyond the normal period to clear the backlog to be qualified for the degree. The general formula therefore should be as follows:
 - a) Time Span = $N+2$ years for the completion of programme.
Where N stands for the normal or minimum duration prescribed for completion of the programme.
 - b) In exceptional circumstance, a further extension of one more year may be granted. The exceptional circumstances be spelt out clearly by the relevant statutory body concerned of the university.
 - c) During the extended period the student shall be considered as a private candidate and also not be eligible for ranking.
- iii) Ordinarily, no student should be given time beyond the extended period of two years. However, in exceptional circumstances and on the basis of the merits of each case university may allow a student one more year for completion of the programme.

CHAPTER-5

PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

5.1 How and where to Apply

The candidates are required to apply Online by logging on the University Website www.gjust.ac.in. The candidates are not required to send any certificate/ document in support of their eligibility and hardcopy/printout of their Application Form (confirmation page) to the University. In the event of any ineligibility being detected by the University at any stage, their candidature shall stand cancelled automatically and the fee deposited, if any, shall be forfeited.

5.2 Admit Card

The candidates are required to download the Admit Card from the University Website www.gjust.ac.in, as per the key dates mentioned in the Prospectus and follow the instructions given in the Admit Card. The Admit Card shall consist of information regarding Roll No. of Candidate, Name of Programme, Date of Entrance Test & its Timing, Examination Centre etc. The Admit Card will not be sent by post separately by the University/College concerned.

5.3 Conduct of Entrance Test

- (i) The course contents/ syllabi for Entrance Test for admission to each PG Programme of the Affiliated Colleges are available on the University Website www.gjust.ac.in and the same can be downloaded by the candidates.
- (ii) The Entrance Test comprising 100 questions of 1 mark each, will be of 1½ hours duration unless otherwise mentioned. It will consist of multiple-choice questions (objective type) with only one correct answer. Instructions for attempting the question paper will be given in the test booklet/question paper at the time of Entrance Test. **There will be no negative marking.**
- (iii) The candidate should report at the Examination Centre at least half an hour before the commencement of the Entrance Test. No candidate will be allowed to enter the Examination Hall after the commencement of Entrance Test. The tests will be held as per schedule given in **Chapter-6 of the Prospectus.**
- (iv) If a candidate is found to be guilty of using unfair means in the Entrance Test, her/his candidature shall be cancelled.
- (v) There shall be no re-evaluation/rechecking of answer sheet of the Entrance Test.

5.4 Schedule of Entrance Tests and display of their result:

The schedule for Entrance Tests, display of result of Entrance Tests for admission to various PG Programmes of the Affiliated Colleges of the University for the session 2022-23 are mentioned below. Note:

1. **There will be common Entrance Test for admission to M.A. (Yoga), PG Diploma in Yoga, and PG Diploma in Yoga and Mental Health programmes offered by different Affiliated Colleges of the University.** However, the candidates are required to submit separate online application form for each programme in case she/he wants to apply for more than one programme to maximize chances of admission in a PG Programme offered by Affiliated Colleges.
2. The State Govt. vide Memo No. DHE-01/04/2022 C-I (4) dated 13.07.2022 and Memo No. DHE-

030022/2/2022-College-2 DHE dated 14.07.2022 has introduced/granted NOC for new programmes/increased seats in the existing programmes, in some colleges w.e.f. session 2022-23. The grant of provisional affiliation of these programmes/ increased seats in the existing programmes are under process and admission in these programmes shall be made after grant of affiliation by the University. **Accordingly, the Schedule of Admission as well as Entrance Test, if any, in respect of M.A. (Sociology), M.Sc. (Psychology), PG Diploma in Remote Sensing & GIS and PG Diploma in Guidance and Counseling offered by the respective colleges mentioned in Chapter-3, shall be issued later on.**

5.5 Procedure / Criteria for Preparing Merit List:

- i) The merit list for admission to a PG Programme of Affiliated College will be drawn on the basis of marks obtained by the candidates in the Entrance Test. It will be subject to fulfilment of eligibility conditions for the programme as given in the Prospectus at **Chapter-3: Eligibility of Admissions**. If two or more candidates obtain equal marks in the Entrance Test, the following criteria will be used for preparation of their merit:
 - a) Candidate senior in age will be given first preference.
 - b) If tie still persists, then the Candidate who has obtained higher marks in 12th Class will be given preference in the Merit List.
 - c) If tie still persists, then the Candidate who has obtained higher marks in 10th Class will be given preference in the Merit List.
- ii) **For Additional Seats for Sports person:** The merit list for admission on two additional seats over and above the sanctioned intake of a PG Programme for the Sports person will be drawn on the basis of Sports Gradation Certificate uploaded on University Website, duly issued by the Govt. of Haryana. The merit list will be subject to fulfilment of eligibility conditions for the programme by the candidates as given in the Prospectus at **Chapter-3: Eligibility of Admissions**. If two or more candidates have equal Sports Gradation, the following criteria, as per order, shall be used for preparation of their merit:
 - a) Candidate obtained higher marks in Entrance Test will be given first preference.
 - b) Candidate senior in age will be given first preference.
 - c) If tie still persists, then the Candidate who has obtained higher marks in 12th Class will be given preference in the Merit List.
 - d) If tie still persists, then the Candidate who has obtained higher marks in 10th Class will be given preference in the Merit List.

Note: The candidates having Sports Gradation Certificate as Grade A, Grade B, Grade C and Grade D in accordance with Notification dated 15.11.2018 of Sports & Youth Affairs Department of Govt. of Haryana will be considered for above said additional seats. For details regarding Sports Gradation Certificate, they are required to visit website of Department of Sports & Youth Affairs, Govt. of Haryana (www.haryanasports.gov.in). Sports Gradation Certificate issued by any other source will not be accepted.

5.6 Categories exercised at the time of submission of “**Online Application Form for Entrance Test**” will be final. However, the candidates may opt Multiple options, wherever applicable, for having their categories/ reservation while submitting “**Online Application Form for Entrance Test** ” e.g. (i) GEN, EWS, ESM, PH, (ii) SC/Deprived SC,ESM,PH etc. (iii) BC,ESM, PH etc. Therefore, the candidates are required to fill up the information relating to their category/ reservation in the “**Online Application Form for Entrance Test**” carefully as the same will be used while preparing the merit list. No Change will be allowed after last date.

5.7 Display of Merit List/ Seat Allocation List for admission

The Merit List/Seat Allocation List(s) will be uploaded on University Website www.gjust.ac.in. It shall be the responsibility of the candidate(s) to remain in touch with the University Website/College concerned to ascertain the progress of admission. No separate communication will be made to the candidate(s) by the University.

CHAPTER-6

COUNSELING/REPORTING

6.1 ADMISSION COUNSELLING / REPORTING SCHEDULE:

The counseling for all PG Programmes will be held through online mode. In the first instance, two online counselings will be conducted for all PG Programmes of Affiliated Colleges of the University. No request will be entertained to change the online counseling schedule. In each counseling, a Seat Allocation List for each PG Programme of a College will be displayed on University Website. The candidates whose names exists in the Seat Allocation List will be required to appear before Admission Committee of the College concerned as per schedule for verification of documents and submission of fees for confirmation of their admission in the respective PG Programme. The schedule of Counseling/Reporting for admission is as under:

6.2 List of documents to be brought by the candidates at the time of Reporting in the College:

The candidates, at the time of reporting to the allotted College, after display of Seat Allocation List on University Website, shall submit their following documents, in original as well as two sets of self-attested photocopies, to the Admission Committee of the College concerned for verification as the case may be:

- (i) 04 latest Passport Size Photographs.
- (ii) Matriculation/ High School Certificate.
- (iii) 10+2/Intermediate/Senior Secondary School Examination Certificate & Detailed Marks Card.
- (iv) DMCs of Qualifying Examinations: Bachelor's Degree i.e. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. or Equivalent Examination and/or Master's Degree or Equivalent Examination as per eligibility of the PG programme. The candidates will bring the DMC's of all years/semesters of Bachelor's or Master's Degree. In case of candidate appearing in the Qualifying Examination and result of (n)th semester/ Year is not declared till the date of Counseling, the Pass Result of first (n-1) semesters/years of qualifying examination is required to produce before the Admission Committee of the College on the day of Reporting, where 'n' stands for total number of semesters/years of qualifying examinations.

(v) The candidate appearing in the qualifying examination are required to submit the Pass Result / DMC of Qualifying Examination or Pass Result/DMC upto (n-1)th semesters/years if the result of nth semester/year is not declared, at the time of Counselling / Reporting failing which her/his candidature for admission to PG programme shall liable to be cancelled by the Admission Committee of the College concerned.

(vi) Character Certificate. The specimen format of Character Certificate is given as Annexure B-VIII.

For Character Certificate:

Candidates, who have recently passed/ appeared in the qualifying examination during 2022, must submit Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended as per specimen given in Annexure B-VIII.

OR

Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination as private candidates should submit their Character Certificate duly signed by a First-Class Magistrate.

OR

Candidates who have gap in their academic career after the qualifying examination, must furnish a gap certificate, in the form of affidavit on non-judicial paper or certificate from the employer (if in service) and should also furnish separately the Character Certificate of gap period duly attested by Notary Public.

(vii) Reserved Category (i.e. SC/Deprived SC/BCA/BCB/PH (Differently-abled person)/ EWS/ ESM/ FF etc. of Haryana) certificate for Reservation in proper format, if applicable. The specimen formats are given as Annexure B-I to B-VII.

(viii) Proper "Income" certificate / Affidavit in case of SC/Deprived SC /BC candidates of Haryana seeking any concession/ reservation.

(ix) Proper "Income and Asset Certificate" in case of EWS candidates of Haryana seeking any concession/reservation. The specimen format is given as Annexure B-VII.

(x) Proper Sports Gradation certificate, duly issued by the Department of Sports & Youth Affairs, Govt. of Haryana, if applied against additional seats for Sports person.

(xi) Printout of Online Application Form for Entrance Test alongwith their locked choice.

(xii) Requisite amount of Fee for the allotted PG Programme of the College concerned as per Fee Structure given at Chapter-8 of the Prospectus.

NOTE:

- a) *The original certificates shall be returned back to the candidates after verification by the concerned College on the same day of reporting.*
- b) *Two sets of self-attested photocopies of certificates/documents/testimonials will be verified & signed by the Principal or her/his authorized representative and will be retained for registration purposes in the University.*
- c) *If the original certificates are not in Hindi/ English, duly certified Hindi/ English version/ translation of such certificates will be required at the time of reporting in the college for admission by the candidates.*

6.3 Submission of proof of passing of Qualifying Examination:

Last date for submission of online result/ Detailed Marks Card (DMC) in the respective college as per eligibility conditions laid down in “Chapter-3: Eligibility for Admissions” of the Prospectus shall be 15.11.2022, for those candidate(s) whose complete result of the qualifying examination are not declared till the date of the Counselling/Reporting. Scanned copy of the online result/DMC/ Digital Locker will also be accepted.

In case of such appearing candidate(s), the result of first (n-1) semesters/ years of qualifying examination is required to be produced by every candidate at the time of counseling, if the result of nth semester/ year is not declared till the date of counseling, where ‘n’ stands for total number of semesters/ years of qualifying examinations. However, the Admission Committee/ Principal of the College concerned must ensure at the time of admission that the qualifying examination of such candidates stands recognized by the University. If a candidate fails to furnish the D.M.C. of having passed the qualifying examination upto prescribed date i.e. 15.11.2022, the admission be cancelled and the fees deposited by her/him will be forfeited.

6.4 Submission of Migration Certificate in Original:

A student from any other University recognized by the UGC or from a Board of Examination other than Board of School Education, Haryana, recognized by Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology shall be eligible for admission to the Affiliated Colleges of the University only on the production of migration certificate (or transfer certificate, if a Board does not issue the migration certificate) to show that the University or Board has no objection to her/his joining this University and she/he will have to submit the same up to 1st October of the year of admission without any late fee, failing which her/his candidature for the concerned examination shall stand suspended automatically. The condition of production of the migration certificate shall not apply to the students who have passed their examination from foreign universities.

Provided that in hard and exceptional cases migration certificate will be accepted with payment of the late fee of Rs.400/-up to 31st October of the year of admission.

Provided further that the Vice-Chancellor may, if deem fit, allow further extension up to 30th November of the year of admission with payment of late fee of Rs. 500/-.

The schedule of submission of migration certificate may further be got extended with or without fine as may be the case after taking necessary approval of the Vice-Chancellor.

6.5 Other Guidelines regarding Reporting at the allotted College:

- i) The Seats Allocation List(s) for 1st and 2nd counselling for admission of candidates in various PG Programmes of the Affiliated Colleges will be displayed on the University Website www.gjust.ac.in. No individual Seat allotment letters will be sent to the candidates by the university.
- ii) Candidates, at the time of reporting, will produce all the required documents/certificates in original alongwith signed print out of their online application form generated from the website of the University.
- iii) At the time of reporting by the Candidate in the College concerned, if documents are found correct on verification and the fee is paid (as mentioned in the Prospectus) by the candidate,

then a **Provisional Admission Letter** will be issued to the candidate by the concerned college. The candidate shall check all the entries in this Provisional Admission Letter and should sign it and preserve it for further reference.

- iv) The admission of the candidates not having the pass result/DMC of nth semester/year of qualifying examination is subject to the production of DMC of final year/ semester showing the minimum percentage marks to be eligible for admission in the respective PG programme. If the candidate is found not to obtain the minimum eligibility marks in qualifying examinations as per the pass result/DMC to be produced later on upto the date prescribed, her/his admission to the said programme shall be cancelled *ab-initio* automatically.
- v) The allotment of seat is liable to be cancelled, if the personal data viz. Category, Sub-category, PG Programme, residential status (Bonafide Residents of Haryana or All India Category), percentage of marks in qualifying examination, gender etc. submitted by the candidates at the time of online registration is found to be wrong at time of verification of the original certificates by the Admission Committee of the allotted college. But in case, if the candidate is found to be eligible after the correction in personal data (i.e. reporting of discrepancy, if any, by the concerned college) the candidate may be considered for subsequent counselling, if any, against the vacant seats only.
- vi) If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by her/him in the 'Online Application Form for Entrance Test ', which is found to be incorrect or false at any stage, then her/his admission shall be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by her/him shall be forfeited. The University/College may take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate in accordance with law.
- vii) If a candidate is selected as per her/his first choice in any counseling and if she/he does not deposit the fee, then she/he will not be allowed to participate in the subsequent online counseling(s). However, she/he will be allowed to participate in the physical counseling only **(date to be announced later on)** on the availability of vacant seat(s).
- viii) If a candidate is not selected on her/his 1st preferred choice and allotted any subsequent choice and interested to retain the same allotted seat in subsequent online counseling, she/he can freeze her/his seat by informing the University through her/his registered email on pgadmission@gjust.org before the prior day of next counseling. If a candidate freezes her/his seat, then she/he will not be allowed to participate in the subsequent online counseling; but she/he will be allowed to participate in the physical counseling.
- ix) If a candidate having admitted in a programme as per Seat Allocation List of first counselling gets selected in other programme/ college in subsequent counselling or physical counselling notified by the University, then she/he is entitled to take refund of her/his fee without any deduction, on the same day of written request, from the previous college. The candidate shall apply for refund of fee in the previous college upto 12:00 Noon on working day, if she/he wants refund on the same day of request.
- x) At present, no seat is available under ESM/FF category. But the seats reserved for the "differently-abled persons/Persons with Disabilities" if remain vacant due to non-availability of candidates eligible to be considered for such seats, shall be offered to the Ex-serviceman and

their wards and the dependents of Freedom Fighters in order of merit, i.e., one who amongst these two categories is higher in merit will get the seat. **This seat shall be filled in physical counseling.**

- xi) The seats remaining vacant in reserved category after the first online counseling, will again be offered to the same reserved category in the second online counseling. There may be more online counseling(s) if seat remain vacant after the second online counseling. The schedule of further online counseling/physical counseling, if any, will be announced later on.
- xii) The instructions regarding conversion of reserved category seats and physical counseling are as under:
 - a) The seats remaining vacant of Backward Class (Block-A) and Backward Class (Block-B) after online counselings will be first offered to the candidates of Backward Class (Block-A) and Backward Class (Block-B) respectively at the start of the physical counselling at 10:00 a.m. if some seats of Backward Class (Block-A) and Backward Class (Block-B) still remain unfilled upto 12.00 noon, these will be filled by drawing combined merit list of the candidates belonging to Backward Class (Block-A) and Backward Class (Block-B) categories at 12.30 p.m. If the seats still remain vacant, these will be converted into General Category of Haryana (HOGC) and filled accordingly at 3.00 p.m.
 - b) The seats remaining vacant of Scheduled Caste and Deprived Scheduled Caste after online counselings will be first offered to the candidates of Scheduled Caste and Deprived Scheduled Caste respectively at the start of the physical counseling at 10:00 a.m. If some seats set aside for candidates from Deprived Scheduled Caste still remain unfilled upto 12:00 Noon due to non-availability of the candidates of Deprived Scheduled Caste, these seat(s) will be made available to the candidates of Scheduled Caste at 12:30 p.m. If the seats of Scheduled Castes and Deprived Scheduled Caste still remain vacant, these will be converted into General Category of Haryana (HOGC) and filled accordingly at 3:00 p.m.
 - c) The seats reserved for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) candidates, if remaining vacant after the online counselling(s) will be first offered to the candidates of the EWS at the start of the physical counseling at 10:00 a.m. and the seats remaining unfilled upto 12.00 noon, after being offered to the candidates of EWS, will be converted into General Category of Haryana (HOGC) and filled accordingly at 3.00 p.m.
 - d) Regarding change from “differently abled person” to ESM/FF category, there will be no such change in the online counseling, but if seats remain unfilled due to non-availability of “differently abled person” eligible candidates in physical counseling, these will be first offered to the relevant category of the candidates, and if the same remain unfilled upto 12.00 noon, these will be filled from the available candidates of ESM/FF category, on merit at 12.30 p.m. If the seats still remain vacant, these will be converted into General Category of Haryana (HOGC) and filled accordingly at 3.00 p.m.
 - e) The seats remaining unfilled in any category upto 3.00 pm will be converted into General Category of Haryana (HOGC) and filled accordingly.

- xiii) Further, the Vice-Chancellor may add any instructions related to Counseling/Reporting for admission to PG Programmes of Affiliated Colleges of the University.
- xiv) In case of any recommendations of the Admission Committee of the College to remove/resolve any discrepancy pointed out at any stage during the admission process, the matter shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor for the final decision.

6.6 Instructions for Colleges:

1. Every affiliated College will strictly follow the Instructions/ Guidelines mentioned in the Prospectus or subsequent instructions/guidelines for admission to PG Programmes of affiliated colleges of the University for the session 2022-23.
2. The Principals of the Affiliated Colleges shall constitute an Admission Committee amongst the teachers of their Colleges as per the General Instruction/ Guidelines for admission to various courses running in affiliated colleges affected from the academic session 2021-22 onward.
3. Verification of documents/certificates of the candidate will be done by the Admission Committee of College from the original documents/certificates made available by the candidate for the admission purpose. At any stage, if the documents/certificates are found to be false/fake, the admission shall automatically be cancelled and fee deposited by the candidate will be forfeited.
4. The Admission Committee of the College may ensure that the Candidate has deposited the requisite fee as per her/his entitlement for PG programme of their college.
5. After successful admission of the candidate in a PG Programme, the college must issue Provisional Admission Letter to the candidate. The original documents/certificates shall be returned back to the candidate on the same day of admission.
6. Colleges are required to refund the fee of a candidate on the day of her/his request to the college without any deduction, if she/he gets selected in other programme/ college in subsequent counselling or physical counselling notified by the University.
7. Colleges are required to update admission status online on the University Website www.gjust.ac.in strictly as per schedule of Admission Counselling/Reporting mentioned above, so that the subsequent counseling may be conducted smoothly as per schedule. No permission of any kind would be provided for admitting students, if status of admission not reported to the University as per above schedule of Admission Counselling/Reporting.
8. Responsibility for any wrong/ irregular/ excess admission will entirely rest upon the Principal of the concerned College.
9. Admission of candidates who have passed their qualifying examination shall be provisional and subject to verification of eligibility by the Registration Branch of the University.
10. All the Rules and Regulations for submission of Registration Return of students by the college will be applicable as per the rules and schedule of the University.

CHAPTER-7

DISTRIBUTION AND RESERVATION OF SEATS

(A) Distribution of seats:

The seats shall be distributed as under: -

(1) All India Category	:	15%
(2) Bonafide Residents of Haryana	:	85%

(B) Reservation of seats for Bonafide Residents of Haryana:

The latest reservation policy of the Haryana Government / to be notified by the Haryana Government from time to time will be followed. The Seat Distribution Chart has been prepared as per the latest Reservation Policy of Government of Haryana as under:

Haryana Open General Category (HOGC)	:	50% of Residents of Haryana
Economic Weaker Section (EWS)	:	10% out of 50% of HOGC
Scheduled Caste (SC)*	:	10%
Deprived Scheduled Caste (DSC)*	:	10%
Backward Class (BCA)	:	16%
Backward Class (BCB)	:	11%
Physically Handicapped/ Differently-abled Persons	:	3%

Economically Weaker Sections (EWS): The persons belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs), who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Castes and Deprived Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) shall get 10% reservation in admission to Government/ Govt. Aided Institutions in the State of Haryana.

Ex-Serviceman & their wards/ dependents of Freedom Fighters : In the event of quota reserved for Differently-abled Persons/ Persons with Disabilities remains unutilized due to non-availability of such candidates, it may be offered to the Ex-Serviceman and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%). Further 3% horizontal reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen / Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of general category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided/ institutes located in Haryana.

As far as block allocation in Block-A and Block-B of Backward Classes category is concerned, year-wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block- A of Backward Classes are given seats in the academic year 2006, the next block i.e., Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2007 and so on.

Vide Notification No. 808-SW (1) dated 17 August, 2016 issued by Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana, the criteria for exclusion of creamy layer within the Backward Classes as per the Schedules appended to the Act, namely Scheduled I, II & III will be as under: -

“The Children of persons having gross annual income of up to three lakh rupees shall first of all get the benefit of reservation in services and admission in educational institutions. The left-out quota shall go to that class of Backward Classes of citizens who earn more than Three Lakh rupees but up to Six

Lakh rupees per annum. The sections of the Backward Classes earning above Six Lakh rupees per annum shall be considered as Creamy Layer under section 5 of the said Act.”

Vide Notification No. 1282-SW (1) dated 28th August, 2018, issued by Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana, the criteria for computing annual income will be as under:

“The Government notification no. 808-SW(1) dated 17.08.2016 has been examined in consultation with the Advocate General Haryana. The Advocate General replying upon the judgement of the Hon’ble Punjab and Haryana High Court has opined that the criteria for computing annual income as prescribed under the above notification as gross annual income shall include income from all sources. All previous notifications or instructions which provided for a different mode of computing annual income stands over-ridden.

Income certificate mentioning gross annual income issued after 17.08.2016 shall only be considered for availing any benefit under BC(A) and BC(B) category.”

Important Instructions for Reserved Category Seats:

1. The reservation of seats will be as per the latest Reservation Policy of the State Govt. revised from time to time.
2. All the eligible candidates whether from Haryana or from Reserved Categories/ EWS shall also compete for seats allocated under All India Category.
3. All eligible candidates of reserved categories / EWS shall be considered first for Haryana General Category seats.
4. For Haryana Residents (the Bonafide residents of Haryana)- Guidelines issued by the Chief Secretary to Government Haryana will be followed (Refer to Annexure A-IV & A-V of the Prospectus 2022-23).
5. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination in regular mode from a University/ College/ School situated within the State of Haryana, will be deemed to be Haryana Residents and will not be required to submit certificate of Bonafide Resident of Haryana.
6. Govt. of Haryana letter No. 62/62/2011-6 GSI dated 17th January, 2012 regarding grant of Bonafide resident of Haryana, the State Govt. has decided that the children/wards/ dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/ technical/ medical Institutions of the State of Haryana.
7. *The Section 3 and 4 of the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in Admission in Government Education Institutions) Act, 2020 (Haryana Act No. 14 of 2020) notified vide letter No. 22/27/2019-1 GS-III dated Chandigarh, the 04th June, 2020 by Chief Secretary to Government Haryana (General Administration Department) provides as under: -

Reservation

3. (1) Twenty percent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.

- (2) Fifty per cent of the twenty per cent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any Government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to Deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the **Annexure B-II**.

Seat not to be carried forward to the next year

4. Where a seat set aside for candidate from deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government educational institutions is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall be made available to the candidate of Scheduled Castes.
8. Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste category / Deprived Scheduled Caste are required to submit the certificate as per **Annexure B-II**, and Backward Class (Block 'A' & 'B') candidates on the prescribed/ specimen format as per **Annexure B-III and affidavit / Undertaking as per Annexure B-IV**.
9. The B.C. candidates (Block 'A' & 'B') for benefit of reservation shall also have to furnish an affidavit / undertaking to the effect that she/he is not covered under the criteria of creamy layer as per Annexure B-IV. The said Affidavit / Undertaking shall be furnished both by the father and mother of the candidate.
10. Candidates claiming reservation under Economically Weaker Section (EWS) are required to submit Income and Asset Certificate on the prescribed/ specimen format as per **Annexure B-VII**.

(A) CRITERIA OF INCOME & ASSETS:

- (1) Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste and Deprived Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e., salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.
- (2) Also, persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following Assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income
- i) 5 acres of agricultural land and above
 - ii) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above
 - iii) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities
 - iv) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities
 - v) Total immovable Assets owned are valued at Rs. One Crore or more
- (3) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- (4) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the persons who apply for benefit of reservation, her/his parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.

(B) INCOME AND ASSET CERTIFICATE ISSUING AUTHORITY AND VERIFICATION OF

CERTIFICATE:

- (1) The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed only upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.
 - (2) The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be as provided at **Annexure B-VII**.
11. Only those candidates having a permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the course) will be considered for admission. "Differently-abled persons" Certificate must be obtained from the Chief Medical Officer heading the constituted Medical Board of the concerned District. "Differently-abled" candidates belonging to Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per **Annexure B-V**.
 12. Children & grand-children (Maternal & Paternal) of Freedom Fighters of Haryana who wish to be considered for reservation shall be required to produce certificate from the office of the Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana (protocol and publicity branch) duly signed and stamped. The candidate should also submit an affidavit counter signed by the Magistrate showing the relationship of the candidate with the freedom fighter. The certificate can also be obtained from Deputy Commissioner of concerned district of Haryana State (**Annexure B-VI**).
 13. A candidate, who applied for both-reserved/ EWS and general categories will be considered first in general category. In case, she/he is not selected in General Category, he /she will be considered in reserved category/EWS. In case a candidate who applies for two reserved category seats, e.g., for SC/ESM, BC/ESM etc. will be considered in both the categories as per the merit in respective category.
 14. The seats remaining vacant under reserved category will be filled up in the manner indicated in the "Chapter-6: Counseling/Reporting" of the Prospectus for Postgraduate Programmes 2022-23 or to be notified on the University Website separately.
 15. If the seats reserved for "differently-abled persons" remain vacant due to non-availability of suitable "differently-abled persons", it may be offered to Ex-servicemen and their wards (1%) and dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%). The reservation policy is subject to revision/ State Government decision and the same, as applicable on the last date of submission of admission form, shall be followed.
 16. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that she/he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time it is discovered that her/his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be forfeited. The University may take such other action against the student and her/his parents/ guardians as it may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.

- i) The State Govt. vide Memo No. DHE-01/04/2022 C-I (4) dated 13.07.2022 and Memo No. DHE-030022/2/2022-College-2 DHE dated 14.07.2022 has introduced/granted NOC for new programmes/increased seats in the existing programmes, in some colleges w.e.f. session 2022-23. However, if any discrepancy is observed by the State Government or any other quarter concerned during the admission process, it may be rectified/ modified with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor.

- iv) *If the number of seats shown for SC and Deprived SC candidates, as per their quantum of reservation notified by the Haryana Government vide letter dated 04th June, 2020 are not equal in the seat matrix in a particular programme, then it will be inter-changed in next academic session.*
- v) *Normally, if the number of calculated seats as per existing Reservation Policy of the State Government in a particular category is not in a round figure, its fractional part below 0.5 has been ignored and the fractional part 0.5 or above has taken as one, provided that the total number of seats under all categories in a programme will not exceed the sanctioned intake.*
- vi) *The University has considered the clarifications of Director, Higher Education Haryana vide Memo. No. KW/30/3-2019 Co(2) dated 07.06.2021 and 24.06.2019 in respect of reservation of Economically Weaker Section (EWS) in Admissions that 10% reservation for EWS will be 50% of the State Quota and will be 42.5% of the total intake (i.e. 50% of General Category out of 85% of Haryana domicile). The above said clarification was given by the Director Higher Education Haryana, Panchkula in reference to instructions issued vide letter No. vide No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 of Govt. of Haryana, General Administration Department. **Accordingly, the committee calculated 10% seats for EWS out of remaining seats of Haryana Open General Category (HOGC).***

Note:

1. If a candidate having admitted in a programme as per Seat Allocation List of first counselling gets selected in other programme/ college in subsequent counselling or physical counselling notified by the University, then she/he is entitled to take refund of her/his fee without any deduction, on the same day of written request, from the previous college. The candidate shall apply for refund of fee in the previous college upto 12:00 Noon on working day, if she/he wants refund on the same day of request.
2. The Scheduled caste candidates of Haryana, who are eligible for Post Matric Scholarship (PMS), need not pay the above prescribed fees at the time of admission of a PG Programme in the affiliated College. They will deposit the fee as and when they receive the scholarship in her/his account through DBT within 30 days of receipt of Scholarship. After this, late fee will be charged by the college concerned.
3. 25% concession of total fees of distance learning programmes will be allowed to the students pursuing regular courses in GJUS&T, Hisar or any other recognized University/College, who are interested simultaneously to join a distance learning programme. The candidate claiming this concession will be required to produce a certificate of bonafide student from the head of the institution concerned. The combinations of programmes are subject to directions of the UGC from time to time. Further, the programmes offered by the University through Distance Education mode are available on the University website.

4. If a candidate is admitted to two programmes in the College, she/he can be permitted to withdraw her/his candidature from the programme other than the programme of her/his choice and can get the refund/ adjustment of the fees.
5. If the admission of a candidate is cancelled by the College for no fault of her/his, the Fees paid by her/him will be refunded.
6. Following clause of UGC vide Notification dated October, 2018 for “Remittance and Refund of Fees” will be followed: -

4.1.3. If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which she/he is enrolled the institution concerned shall follow the following five-tier system for the refund of fees** remitted by the student.

Sr. No.	Percentage of Refund of fees**	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is received in the Higher Educational Institutions (HEI)
(1)	100%	15 days or more before the formally-notified last date of admission.
(2)	90%	Less than 15 days before the formally-notified last date of admission.

(4)	50%	30 days or less, but more than 15 days, after formally-notified last date of admission.
(5)	00%	More than 30 days after formally-notified last date of admission.

****NOTE:**

- 4.1.4 In case of (i) in the table above, the Higher Educational Institutions (HEI) concerned shall deduct an amount not more than 5% of the fees paid by the students, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5000/- as processing charges from the refundable amount.
- 4.1.5 Fees shall be refunded by all Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from her/him in this regard.
6. Further, the Refund Policy of University/State Govt./UGC or any other concerned Statutory Body of programme received from time to time will be followed for refund of fees to the candidate at the time of withdrawal/cancellation of admission of a candidate from a programme in the College.
7. In case of sudden demise of any candidate during study, the fees paid by her/him for the session of demise may be refunded, if claimed by the parents.
8. Old students will continue to pay their fees as per the prospectus of the year of their admission.
9. Dues for the subsequent years must be paid as per schedule, otherwise late fee/ fine, if any applicable, shall be paid by the students.
10. The name of the defaulter shall stand struck off the Rolls of the College, if the dues are not paid up to the prescribed date. Such students may be re-admitted by the Principal of the College concerned on payment of requisite fee, along with the arrears of fee and fine provided that Principal is satisfied that the student will not fall short of the requisite percentage of lectures.

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No. 62/17/95-6 GSI Dated 3rd October, 1996, No. 62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23rd May, 2003 and No. 62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29th July, 2003 by the Chief Secretary to Government Haryana.

Subject: Bonafide residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding.

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate: -

- i) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
- ii) Children / Wards (if parents are not living) / Dependents of the: -
 - (a) Employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
 - (b) Employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
 - (c) Employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
- iii) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
- iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
- v) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
- vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
- vii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above-mentioned categories are:
 - a) Citizen of India;

- b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
- viii) Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana.
2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-Divisions to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children /Wards/ Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examinations from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster from concerned institution, where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and her/his parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.

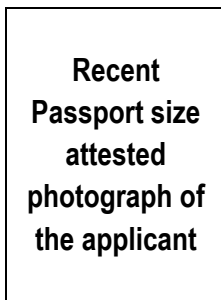
